



# Yale Reunion Giving 2026

## WHAT IS A REUNION GIFT?

- A reunion gift is a “stretch” commitment above and beyond ongoing annual support of the Alumni Fund or other areas of the university.
- Payments may be made over as many as five years.
- Reunion gifts typically comprise:
  - A larger-than-usual unrestricted gift to the Alumni Fund
  - A multi-year annual pledge
  - A capital or planned gift paired with an Alumni Fund contribution

## WHAT COUNTS IN THE REUNION GIFT?

Nearly all new gifts and pledges made from July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2026, including:

- Annual gifts to the Yale College Alumni Fund
- Contributions to graduate or professional school annual/alumni funds
- Capital gifts to specific purposes, e.g., financial aid, travel fellowships, research, and faculty support
- Gifts to athletic associations
- Many types of planned gifts, including bequest intentions or charitable gift annuities

*Class dues and secret society contributions do not count in the reunion gift.*

## WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Conversations with Yale staff, Alumni Fund class agents, and reunion gift committee members will provide opportunities to discuss gift options.

## WHY IS THE REUNION GIFT IMPORTANT?

- Support for students and faculty sustains Yale's world-class teaching and research.
- Every dollar counts! Participation is a benchmark of alumni satisfaction and the fiscal health of the university.
